## D&T: Sewing

Needle -



Running stitch - A simple stitch using short lines that do not overlap.

Cross stitch - A stitch formed by two stitches crossing each other in an x shape.



Detail - Items such as buttons, beads and sequins that can be added to an item.

Evaluate - To assess previously made items based on the details used.

Design - To use practiced skills and incorporate them into a plan.

## Science: Animals including Humans

Skeleton - Used to support and give structure to the body of animals including humans.

Bones - Makes up the skeleton. A human has over 200 bones in their body and children have more than adults.

Skull - The head of a skeleton made up of many bones which protect the brain.

Ribs - The ribs are bones that make up the rib cage. They support the skeleton and protect important organs such as the heart.

Spine - Sometimes called the back-bone helps you to sit, stand, walk, twist and bend.

Muscles - Help us to move our body.

Joint - Where 2 bones are fitted together in the body.



## History:

Pre-historic - Something from a period of time which took place a very long time ago before history was written about and recorded.

Fossil - An imprint or remains of a plant or prehistoric animal that has been in the ground for a long time and become hardened rock.

Artefact - Remains of human life, activities or objects that are found many years later.

Archaeologist - A person who studies artefacts and ancient people from the remains of their buildings that have been dug up from the ground.

Bronze Age - A prehistoric time when weapons and tools were made of bronze.

Iron Age - A prehistoric time when weapons and tools were made from iron.



## Geography—Continents and Oceans

Map - A representation of an area showing key physical features such as roads and rivers.

Physical feature - Natural features such as rivers.

Human feature - Things around us built by humans such as bridges and buildings.

Country- A place with its own government.

Continent—a continuous expanse of land.

Ocean—a large body of water
