Science: Evolution and Inheritance

Fossils - the remains or impression of a prehistoric plant or animal embedded in rock and preserved.

Offspring - a person's child or children.

Adaptation - the process of change by which an organism or species becomes better suited to its environment.

Environment - the surroundings or conditions in which a person, animal, or plant lives or operates.

Evolution - the process by which different kinds of living things are believed to have developed from earlier forms over a long period of time.

Characteristics - a feature or quality belonging typically to a person, place, or thing.

Inheritance - a characteristic that is inherited from somebody else (relative.)

History—Local History

Chronology- the order of events

Continuity - the continuance of themes over time, or similarities over time.

Characteristics - a special quality or trait that makes a person, thing, or group different from others

Transition - the process or a period of changing from one school to another.

Prejudice - judging someone unfairly before you even know them well, like making assumptions about someone because of their race, religion, or gender

Stereotypes - a generalised, often unfair, idea about a person or group of people based on their appearance or behaviour.

Manipulation- controlling someone or something to your own advantage, often unfairly or dishonestly

Critical consumer- someone who thinks carefully about what they buy and how they spend their money

Geography: Local study of Boston and the surrounding area

Field work - the process of observing and collecting data about people, cultures, and natural environments

Sustainability - the practice of using natural resources responsibly, so they can support both present and future generations

Tourism -the temporary movement of people to locations outside their usual environment, primarily for leisure, recreation, or personal reasons.

Trade -the buying and selling of goods and services between different regions, countries, or even individuals.
