

Year 1 Term 6

Science

Plant- a living organism such as flowers or trees



Flower- the part of a plant that is often brightly coloured and has a pleasant smell



Petal- one of the often brightly coloured parts of a flower



Stem- helps to support a plant/ flower and keep it standing upright. It also carries water and nutrients to different parts of the plant

Roots- help to anchor the plant in the soil so it does not fall over. They also absorb water and nutrients from the soil



Seed- the small part produced by plants from which new plants grow



Leaf- attached to the stem of a plant. Leaves catch sunlight to help the plant make food.



Trunk- the main stem of a tree



Branch- parts of a tree that grow out from the trunk and have leaves, flowers, or fruit growing on them



Bark- the tough, protective covering of a tree

Bud- small part of a plant that turns into a flower or leaf

Maths

O'clock- for o'clock times, the minute hand (long hand) points to the 12.



Half past- for half past times, the minute hand (long hand) points to the 6.



Seconds- a shorter period of time than minutes. There are 60 seconds in 1 minute.

Minutes- a shorter period of time than an hour. There are 60 minutes in 1 hour.

Hours- a period of 60 minutes. There are 24 hours in a day.

Money- children will recognise and know the value of different coins.



Notes- once children are able to identify and recognise coins they need to be able to recognise notes.

Music

Timbre- all instruments, including voices have a certain sound



Pulse- another word for 'beat'. It's the thing that makes you tap your foot

Rhythm- long and short sounds

Rhythmic pattern- the repetition of long and short sounds

Composition- a piece of musical work that has been created

Singing- use of voice in a variety of ways

Design and Technology

Needle- a long, metal tool with a pointed tip at one end and a hole to hold the sewing thread



Binka- a type of fabric with open weaves used for cross-stitch



Thread- a long, thin piece of cotton, skills etc., used for sewing

Running stitch- small stitches made by passing the needle in and out of fabric repeatedly. Running stitches look the same on both sides of the fabric
