Programme - a way to tell computers and robots what to do

Algorithm - set of rules for technology

Debug—to find a mistake in a programme and fix it

Clockwise - the same direction which the hands on a clock move.

Anticlockwise - the opposite direction to which the hands on a clock move

Repeating pattern - a pattern that is the same over and over again

Quarter turn - a 90 degree turn

Leaf - a flat part of a plant which is attached to a stem

Roots - the part of a plant which grows under the ground

Seed—a plant part from which a new plant grows

Stem - the part of a plant which grows above the ground and which holds the leaves and flowers

Bulb - a rounded structure which acts as a food store; a new plant will sprout and grow from it

Conditions - factors that affect a living thing

Germinate - when a seed starts to grow

Healthy - well

Light - produced by a light source and makes it possible for the eye to see things

Mature - has completed its development
